She received her medical degree from Case Western Reserve University, did her internal medicine residency at Huntington Memorial and an infectious disease fellowship at UCLA. She returned to Huntington in 1992 as teaching faculty and is an assistant professor of clinical medicine at USC Keck School of Medicine. She has a private practice in infectious disease and supervises The Phil Simon HIV Clinic and the Pasadena Travel Clinic. Her research interests focus on HIV, zoonotic infections and global health issues.
